CEO, Sara Lurie then provided verbal updates on the following items from her written report:

CMHAM Action Item Alert

A copy of the CMHAM Weekly Update Action Alert was distributed to each CMHA-CEI Board of Directors member for review and information. HB4707 is a very comprehensive mental health and substance use disorder parity legislation that would provide real parity for those with commercial insurance for the first time in Michigan (sponsored by Rep. Brabec).

Additionally, CEO Lurie shared HB No. 4909, which is a bill to amend 1998 A 386, entitled "Estates and protected individuals code, reporting that this bill has become problematic quickly.

ACTION: A copy of the official HB 4707 ACTION ALERT will be sent to CMHA-CEI staff, CMHA-CEI Board of Directors as well as Elected and Appointed officials, which will provide an opportunity to tell your legislator to VOTE YES on HB 4707.

CMHA-CEI is currently nearing the end of a three-year contract with MDOC that totals \$825,000, or \$225,000 annually, for the period of October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2023. This amendment will revise and extend the expiration date to September 30, 2024. This amount is a cap and there is no guarantee of revenue under such a fee for service contract. The extension allows CMHA-CEI to utilize remaining funding.
