^{*} On rare occasions, consumers may be admitted to the hospital who require substantially higher amounts of one to one staffing than is typical, due to highly aggressive or self-injurious behavior. Payor shall prior authorize up to two days Enchanted Staffing Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Consumers in this situation on a case by case basis. Criteria for Enhanced Staff Inpatient Psychiatric Services are as follows:

- 1) The Consumer must meet all of the Inpatient Admission Certification Criteria listed above (Diagnosis, Severity of Illness, and Intensity of Service).
- 2) The Consumer is failing at least restrictive placement despite active treatment, with no exceptions of improvement in a timely manner, combined with risk factors to Customers or Hospital such as: Swallowing behavior on unit, aggression towards others, and/or extreme property destruction at such a level that Consumer requires constant attention from staff in order to prevent self-harm, harm others, or extreme property destruction.

Emily Stivers distributed a copy of the 2019 millage planning calendar on behalf of the liaison committee reporting that the millage will be placed on the 2020 primary ballot in March. However, would like for the board members to start thinking about some language changes and an estimated funds request amount.

Ms. Stivers reported that this millage will replace the existing millage and will include stronger language as well as an increase in the rate. Agencies who have requested funds include: 911, Potter Park, Park & Trails, CATA. However, there have been some additional request for funds by Ingham County Jail and Tri-County Office on Aging.

Denise Shorter shared her desire to get involved in the Consumer Advisory Council, peer support groups and advocacy opportunities.

Daniel Arnold expressed concern and frustration regarding continuity of care related to the high turn-over of case managers and requested that CMHA-CEI work on this as an agency.

Elizabeth Pratt distributed copies of the Signature Programs FY19 – 20 and thanked Sara Lurie for the opportunity to collaborate on the recent letter regarding non-violence and mental illness as we move forward on some of these very difficult conversations and issues. Ms. Pratt also thanked Sara Lurie for her willingness to host the peer-to-peer 8 week course for adults with mental illness classes at CMHA-CEI which is scheduled to start on October 2. Other upcoming events during mental illness awareness week include a conversation on youth mental health, entitled: Coming up for Air. A showing is scheduled on October 7 at Harry Hill Auditorium.
