Board member, Joe Brehler reported that the MSHN Board of Directors met in the month of November. Two items of interest:

CEO REPORT

CEO, Sara Lurie introduced Jennifer Stanley, MD, who presented on the new Psychiatric Services Clinic. Highlights from the presentation included:

- New combined clinic providing psychiatric services to CSDD and AMHS patients at Jolly Road, Suite 216
- PSC Layout, Waiting Room, Clinic Space, Telepsychiatry room
- 1429 patients currently enrolled (as of 11/10/22)
- 556 CSDD including children
- 873 AMHS
- 5736 Billable Services in FY2022
- 2149 Injections
- 3365 E&M Visits for established patients
- 222 Psychiatric Evaluations Completed

Questions:

- 1. Are children with SED and DD clients served in different clinics? No, same clinic. Dr. Stanley advised that on occasion children with SED develop an Adult Disorder and therefore are opened with an Adult Psychiatrist. Additionally, CMHA-CEI has a child psychiatrist who sees children with DD who are sometimes advanced to the Psychiatric Clinic as it is more beneficial to coordinate care through the case managers.
- 2. Are there any rooms equiptted for Autism? No, at this time we do not have any sensory friendly environments. However, Sara Lurie commented that we are looking forward to adding these type of rooms with the addition of the Crisis Services Unit clinic. Additionally, Dr. Stanley reported that this has not been an issue as many of the autism patients continue to utilize the telepsychiatry services as not to be in an overly stimulated environment.

Board member Raul Gonzales thanked Dr. Stanley for her diligent work in building strong partnerships and relations in the community to offer IRIS telepsychiatry to CEI patients and commented that significant strides with staffing have also been made. Dr. Stanley noted that she would definitely like to have more regular staff.

However, she is grateful for the IRIS telehealth psychiatry and locum tenus arrangements, which she continues to explore.
