New Expense Contract: Henry Ford Behavioral Health Hospital
Shana Badgley presented this item for a new psychiatric hospital option. This
hospital is located in West Bloomfield. Shana is hopeful our community can add
beds soon so we don't have to send folks out of town for placement.

hospital services at the rates indicated below for the period of March 1, 2025 through September 30, 2025.

^{*}On rare occasions, consumers may be admitted to the hospital who require substantially higher amounts of one to one staffing than is typical, due to highly aggressive or self-injurious behavior. Payor shall prior authorize up to two days Enhanced Staffing Inpatient Psychiatric Services for Consumers in this situation on a case by case basis. Criteria for Enhanced Staff Inpatient Psychiatric Services are as follows:

- 1. The Consumer must meet all of the Inpatient Admission Certification Criteria listed above (Diagnosis, Severity of Illness, and Intensity of Service).
- 2. The Consumer is failing at least restrictive placement despite active treatment, with no expectation of improvement in a timely manner, combined with risk factors to Customers or Hospital such as: Swallowing behavior on unit, aggression towards others, and/or extreme property destruction at such a level that Consumer requires constant attention from staff in order to prevent self-harm, harm others, or extreme property destruction.

New Revenue Contract: Ingham County 911 Central Dispatch (Full-Time Crisis Call Taker Services)

Shana Badgley said she and Sara Lurie were approached by dispatch in Ingham County regarding the funding of two Mental Health Therapist positions to assist with 911 mental health calls. This is an exciting new project! Shana said the positions will likely be covering 10am to 10pm 7 days a week. Sara is hoping this will reduce the need to deploy police and EMT to each call and to send a mobile crisis team from CEI instead. Shana said CEI and the county have been working behind the scenes on this project for several months. She thinks we are still 8-12 weeks out from someone starting in this position.

enter into a new contract with the Ingham County 9-1-1 Central Dispatch to provide the clinical support at the 9-1-1 Call Center for the retroactive period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2025 and receive up to \$309,012.00.

New Expense Contract: Anikare Inc.

Drew Kersjes presented this new contract for CLS services. This individual we support out of county will be able to move to a fewer-bed facility with this contract.

New Revenue Contract: Ingham County Health Department (ICHD) - Opioid Crisis Response Grant

KC Brown presented this new contract for a part-time Peer Recovery Coach. The goal would be to respond in 24-72 hours to nonfatal overdoses within the community to connect or reconnect folks with services and resources to aid in recovery. Dianne asked where the funding comes from? Sara said this is money from the Opioid settlement from the various companies required to provide the funds as part of the settlement.

ACTION:

MOVED by Al Platt and SUPPORTED by Jeanne Pearl-Wright that the Program and Planning Committee of the CMHA-CEI Board of Directors authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into a new contract with the Ingham County Health Department to provide follow up care for individuals in Ingham County who had a nonfatal overdose and receive \$77,718.00 for the retroactive period of January 1, 2025 through December 31, 2026 for those services.

<u>Unfinished Business</u>

a. Crisis Stabilization Unit Update

Sara said the demolition at the Greenlawn campus is moving along nicely. Later this week, John Peiffer, Sara and Sue Panetta are going to complete a walk-through to verify the amount of work completed thus far. John is attending all of the Ingham County Building Authority meetings. Sara hopes we won't be hit with tariff-related adjustments as the project moves forward.

Sara said the certification requirements will be going out for public comment very soon; after that, they go to the legislature for official approval. Piper and Gold are working on the logo – they brought ideas to the CAC and received good feedback. They are also working on a community presentation for the surrounding Greenlawn neighborhood. Directors are working on job descriptions. We are hoping to get nurses in early to begin training in Crisis Services. This way we can be sure to spend the grant money that expires at the end of this year.

Sara sent Board members an email today regarding advocacy requests and information from a national policy briefing she participated in.

New Business

Dwight Washington wanted to thank Sara for sending along the Medicaid advocacy information to the Board.

Dwight then mentioned that Clinton County is planning to dispense Opioid settlement dollars and he would like to have a coordinated approach between all three counties. Sara said this was discussed at a previous meeting, but all counties felt they had to focus on their own counties' needs. Ingham County has done a lot of strategic planning on how to spend the money, but she's unsure of Clinton County's plan. Dwight said it would be a good time for Sara to reach out to Clinton County to ask about their plans for this money.

Dwight then noted that there seems to be an increase in mental health issues in Clinton County and he's hearing that folks are looking for services for physical and

mental health. Sara said she can have a discussion with Dwight on how to best connect these folks.

Raul wanted to say that Daniel Arnold did a presentation at last week's conference and he did a great job!
