**CMHA-CEI begins new Crisis Care Center hiring push with nurses and more**

*June 25 hiring fair will connect registered nurses and other positions with immediate opportunities to support behavioral health care in a state-of-the-art center in Lansing*

**LANSING, Mich.** — A safe, supportive place for care begins with a team of people who make healing possible. The [Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton and Ingham Counties](#) (CMHA-CEI) will host a Nursing Hiring Fair for its new [Crisis Care Center](#) on Thursday, June 25, from noon to 5 p.m. at 2900 Stabler St. The event will connect nurses and other mental health professionals with career opportunities tied to one of the region’s most significant behavioral health investments. The new Crisis Care Center, located on the former McLaren Greenlawn campus, will expand access to compassionate, timely behavioral health support for youth, adults and families across the community. Nursing positions within Adult Crisis Services and Youth Crisis Services (Families Forward) are available immediately. The Crisis Care Center will continue hiring for nursing, clinical and other positions as it opens in phases over the next year, including for the region’s first Crisis Stabilization Unit for both adults and children.

CMHA-CEI is now hiring registered nurses for full-time, part-time, relief and float positions, with day, night, weekday and weekend shifts available. Compensation ranges from \$63,420.02 to \$71,986.64 annually, or \$30.49 to \$34.61 per hour, with annual increases up to \$85,730. Compensation may be adjusted based on relevant education and experience. Shift incentives include an additional \$1.25 per hour for hours worked from 5 p.m. to midnight, \$2 per hour for hours worked from midnight to 8 a.m. and \$3 per hour for weekend hours worked from 5 p.m. Friday to 8 a.m. Monday.

Current open RN positions include:

- Adult Crisis Services.
- Youth Crisis Services (Families Forward).
- Mobile Crisis Services.
- Bridges Crisis Unit (24/7 short-term treatment and care).
- Integrated Treatment and Recovery Services.

“We’re looking for registered nurses and other professionals who lead with skill, compassion and a deep commitment to meeting people with dignity,” said Sara Lurie, CEO of CMHA-CEI. “The care nurses provide reaches far beyond one moment. It helps strengthen families, foster trust, build stability and support the wellbeing of the whole community.”

The event will allow nursing and other candidates to learn more about the Crisis Care Center, meet with HR and Crisis Care Center hiring staff, and experience a tour around the new facilities. CMHA-CEI plans to hire 33 clinical roles and 63 total positions as different units and services of the Crisis Care Center come online over the next year.

Attendees are encouraged to dress in business casual attire and bring a current resume. “This is a unique opportunity for registered nurses to help shape a new model of crisis care in our region,” Lurie said. “This work is about helping individuals and families feel seen and supported as they take their next steps. It’s about creating a care environment that guides people toward hope and healing.”

As the organization prepares to open the facility, this hiring fair will help build the nursing team that supports individuals and families on the path toward healing and hope.
