What is Limited English Proficiency (LEP)?

Limited English Proficiency (LEP) refers to individuals who do not speak English as their primary language and have a limited ability to read, write and/or understand English, at a level that permits effective interaction with health care providers and social service agencies. It is also inclusive to those who experience a visual and/or hearing impairment.



Who is covered by LEP?

All persons served by CMHA-CEI qualify for language assistance if they have LEP needs.

Examples of persons needing assistance may include:

- Individuals using English as a second language
- Individuals who experience a hearing impairment and/or use sign language
- Individuals who experience visual impairments



Why do you need to know about LEP?

• Staff Responsibilities:

• Staff must identify and address communication needs related to Limited English Proficiency (LEP), visual, or hearing impairments to ensure access to treatment and support.

Legal Obligation & Common Languages:

- LEP compliance is a legal requirement based on various laws (e.g., Civil Rights Act, Balanced Budget Act, Executive Order 13166 and Meaningful Language Act 241).
- Most requested languages Interpreter Services (spoken):
 - Spanish, Arabic, Somali and American Sign Language.
- Most requested languages Translated Services (written)
 - Spanish, Arabic



Your obligations to persons served with LEP needs?

Access & Communication Standards:

 CMHA-CEI must prevent discrimination and ensure equal access to services for individuals with LEP, visual, or hearing impairments. Persons served have a right to an interpreter, free of charge.

• Interpreter Use Policy:

• Staff may not use minors, family members, friends, or other clients as interpreters (except in emergencies). If a person chooses a family member/friend, it must be documented in a contact or service note and confirmed the interpreter is not a minor.

Translated Documents

 You are required to translate vital documents for persons served who request them in their preferred language.


