The American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP) Walk

The CAC discussed their interest in forming a CMHA-CEI team for the AFSP Out of Darkness walk in October.

ACTION: Elise Magen will explore pricing and options and will bring the agenda item back to the next CAC meeting for further planning.

OPR Training

Becki West, Customer Service Representative, facilitated Question, Persuade, Refer (QPR) suicide prevention training for CAC members. The training included information about how to Question, Persuade and Refer someone who may be suicidal, the common causes of suicidal behavior, the warning signs of suicide, and how to get help for someone in crisis.

Mid-State Health Network (MSHN) Update:

Newly appointed, MSHN representative, Tim Hanna thanked Paul Palmer for taking him under his wings at the first meeting, which Mr. Hanna commented was very concerning based on the following information:

- FY24 ended with 24-million-dollar deficit, due to lower revenue and higher utilization eroding the service fund.
- MDHHS rate revenue projections for 2025-2026 is not yet available.
- PHIP procurement possibly by June, no new information on issue.

The FY for MSHN is October 1. It is hard to know what the budgeting process will look like going forward! CEO Lurie, commented that the first cohorts are all doing fine, which includes CMHA-CEI as we had time to build up risk reserve and have several different revenue streams. However, those who came in on the second or third cohorts are in the red.

CEO Report

CEO, Sara Lurie introduced Suzanne Panetta, Chief Financial Officer, who introduced Amy Rottman, Rehmann Accountant, Contractor, who presented the first installment of the Finance 101 training, intended to be a high level overview. Ms. Rottman presented a high level overview and covered the following information:

- Funding Overview
- Medicaid & Healthy Michigan Capitated Funding
- Medicaid & Healthy Michigan Capitated Services
- Medicaid and Healthy Michigan Capitation Funding vs. Expense
- CCBHC Funding
- CCBHC Services
- CCBHC Funding vs. Expense
- General Fund Funding
- General Fund Services

The following questions were asked:

When someone is incarcerated does their Medicaid remain active? Yes, Medicaid is active, but cannot be billed for services. Case Managers and Eligibility staff work closely with inmates prior to their release date to be sure there are no gaps in coverage.

Over the years, CMHA-CEI has had large surplus and were required to return funds to the PIPH. Why is this? The funding mechanisms are determined at the PIHP level, which is not sound as it should not be the same for all CMHs and all regions.

Are we able to use some of the surplus funds to acquire properties, etc.? No, surplus

funds cannot acquire assets. Funds must be used for services based on the Michigan provider manual.

Why does Clinton County outsource residential treatment for youth? Residential treatment is not part of the behavioral services, therefore there is no billing code. These services are provided by Juvenile Justice and Child Welfare.

ACTION: Sue and Amy inquired as to what other topics board members might be interested in hearing more about and asked that those topics be forwarded to CEO, Lurie for review and consideration.

CEO Report continued

CEO, Sara Lurie presented the May CEO Report. Highlights from the report included the following:

Special thank you to those board members who were able to attend the Cedar Roots Recovery (CRR), formerly known as the House of Commons (HOC), official launch of its new identity with a refreshed mission, updated facilities, and a renewed focus on inclusive, person-centered care. Cedar Roots Recovery Spring Open House, which took place on May 16th from 2pm to 4pm at 706 Curtis St, Mason, MI 48854.

The event was open to the public. Guests enjoyed free grilled brats, hot dogs, and ice cream provided by Udderly Delicious, and the Medicaid Round Table discussion hosted by CMHA-CEI on Wednesday, May 21 from 10 – 11am, in the Atrium by the Protect MI Healthcare Coalition and Michigan League for Public Policy, and Bellwether Public Relations. It means so much to our staff!

ACTION: A copy of the Medicaid Round Table recording will be sent to CMHA-CEI Board members and staff. Additionally, Protect MI Healthcare Coalition and Michigan League for Public Policy has forwarded a copy to Congressman Barrett's office.

Other CEO Report Updates provided by CEO, Sara Lurie included the following:

• Congratulations to Christy Granger, LBSW on her recent 2024 Civilian of the Year Award

Christy Granger, CMHA-CEI Community/Court Liaison Coordinator received the 2024 Civilian of the Year Award presented by the Lansing Police Department. CEO, Lurie commented that Christy plays a key role for those who are on a court order, noting that she is involved at probate and treatment level, and provides coordination for services based on community need. CMHA-CEI congratulates Christy on this community recognition.

Recipient Rights Audit

CMHA-CEI is celebrating the great outcome of the recent Recipient Rights Audit and extended kudos to Elise Magen, Director of Quality Customer Services and Recipient Rights, and the Recipient Rights and Quality Advisors for their hard work and dedication in preparing for the recent audit.

Federal Budget

There is a lot swirling around us right now with the federal budget, state budgets underway. Much advocacy is needed at both levels to assure stability of the behavioral health system. We are hearing that the Michigan House has not yet begun serious budget development and that it will likely be an extended process. Stay tuned!

• Financial Status of our region and PIHP Region

CMHA-CEI remains concerned about the financial status of our PIHP region, reporting that while CMHA-CEI continues to be stable at, it appears that MSHN ISF will be nearly depleted and they will enter the state's risk corridor if rates are not adjusted this year and improved for next year. Director Hertel recently told CMHAM that there will not be a rate adjustment unless a boilerplate language is submitted in a supplemental request by legislators as there is no new money to appropriate. All funds have been appropriated. This is contradicting as we had been told previously there would be an adjustment in May.

• Adelante Forward Article

CEO, Lurie shared that there is a "Community Care Services" article regarding After hours' clinic, in the Spring 2025 publication with one page in English and one page in Spanish.

• Eastern High School Historical Brick Presentation to Board Member, Dr. Paula Yensen

Board Member, Dr. Paula Yensen, was presented with a brick from the historical Eastern High School building from the recent demolition. Dr. Yensen commented that she will cherish the brick for a lifetime and acknowledged the sentimental value.

Rochester Hills, Michigan 48309 in the amount of \$233,495.93 to install CCTV Cameras, all wiring, servers and associated mounting hardware and system programing and commissioning included so as to deliver it to CMHA-CEI in ready-to-operate condition at the new Crisis Care Center - 2900 Stabler Lansing, Michigan 48910.

Discussion ensued regarding life span of equipment and compatibility of card reader system to allow badges to be used across buildings. John Peiffer advised that the life span is about 5 years and the system is compatible and will allow staff to utilize card readers across buildings.

<u>Recommendation to Purchase of Building and Property – 5913 Executive Drive</u> ACTION:

MOVED by Tim Hanna and SUPPORTED by Raul Gonzales that the Board of Directors of the Community Mental Health Authority of Clinton, Eaton, and Ingham Counties authorize CMHA-CEI to enter into negotiations to purchase the building and property located at 5913 Executive Drive Lansing, Michigan 48911 from LAG (Lafontaine Auto Group) Executive Drive LLC., a Michigan limited liability company of 4000 West Highland Road Highland, Michigan 48357 as seller for the amount estimated between \$3,200,000 and \$4,200,000 and bring back the final sale price and purchase details in June for approval to proceed with the purchase.

Discussion ensued. CEO, Lurie clarified that the purpose of this motion is to allow CMHA-CEI to continue to negotiate and move forward with an inspection with the understanding that this item would be brought back to the board with a detailed evaluation including a baseline environmental study and thorough analysis. Sue Panetta, CFO commented that space continues to be an issue and the purchase of this space would allow us to stop leasing space, which we currently are spending approximately \$45,000 per month on leases, consolidate into nice space that we own, which would be more cost effective, and offer the opportunity to adjacent and reposition programs. John Peiffer shared that there are 370 parking spaces around the building; outlining 2 parking lots that will be retained by LaFontaine which were not utilized when building was up and operational. Land value analysis is approximately \$700,000,

and currently being managed by Colliers Property Management. CMHA-CEI's offer of \$3,200.000 takes into consideration the 2 parking lots LaFontaine will retain.
